Youth Symphony of Southern Oregon 2016-2017 Concert Season opens with performances of Les Preludes by Franz Liszt and Horn Concerto No. 4 by W.A. Mozart

The Youth Symphony of Southern Oregon's 29th Concert Season opens with Fall Concert Series performances on November 5 & 6, 2016. Music Director and Conductor Cynthia Hutton commented, "The Youth Symphony of Southern Oregon looks forward to another fantastic season of performances by outstanding young instrumental musicians from throughout our region. The season will include audience favorites, standard literature, performances by a Youth Symphony alumna and our 2016 Concerto Competition winner, and special musical surprises."

The Fall Concert Series includes a 7:30 p.m. performance at Medford's Craterian Theater at the Collier Center for the Performing Arts on Saturday, November 5. The series continues with an Ashland performance at the Oregon Center for the Arts Music Recital Hall at SOU at 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, November 6. Tickets are \$10 (general admission) and \$5 (students w/ID). Tickets for the November 5 performance in Medford are available through the Craterian Theater box office (541-779-3000). Other ticket outlets include Paddington Station, located at 125 East Main Street in Ashland, and Artistic Piano in Medford, 1390 Biddle Road #107.

Under the direction of Music Director & Conductor Cynthia Hutton, the Youth Symphony will play Les Preludes by Franz Liszt and W.A. Mozart's Horn Concerto No. 4 with Alison Dresser, Youth Symphony alumna, as soloist. The Youth Orchestra will play Beethoven's Symphony No. 6 "Pastoral" (arr. Meyer), a march from Franz von Suppé's opera Fatinitza (arr. Pfortner) and excerpts from Richard Wagner's opera Die Meistersinger (arr. Siennicki).

More than 140 accomplished public school, private school, home school and college musicians from Medford, Ashland, Grants Pass, Jacksonville, Central Point, Talent, Phoenix, Williams, Klamath Falls and the surrounding region, including Fort Jones and Tulelake, California, were selected to participate in the Youth Symphony and Youth Orchestra this season.

Alison Dresser, guest soloist and Youth Symphony of Southern Oregon alumna, currently attends Northwestern University where she studies music performance and plays in the Northwestern University Symphony Orchestra. Her private teachers are Gail Williams and Jonathan

Boen. She has participated in master classes led by Radovan Vlatković and David Pvatt, and has attended several institutes and workshops including the Kendall Betts Horn Workshop and the American Institute of Musical Studies in Graz, Austria. She has played for Oregon Shakespeare Festival and Rogue Opera productions, as well as in the Britt Festivals Orchestra and Rogue Valley Symphony.

The daughter of Bruce Dresser and Marcia Pinneau and a graduate of Ashland High School, Alison played in YSSO orchestras for 10 years. She was a winner of the 2011 Concerto Competition and the featured soloist with the Youth Symphony. Alison studied horn privately with Cindy Hutton, and studied cello and piano with Lisa Truelove. Her many honors include placing first at both the 2012 and 2013 Oregon State Solo Competitions (horn).

Following graduation from Northwestern University, Alison plans to attend graduate school and continue horn study and pursue performance opportunities. She shared that she wishes to thank her parents for "supporting and believing in me" and Cindy Hutton for her guidance and for providing a "strong foundation on the horn."

Alison is playing the Horn Concerto No 4 by W.A. Mozart with the Youth Symphony on November 5 and 6, 2016.

From the Music Director...

Welcome back to the musicians, families, community volunteers, patrons and audiences! I hope everyone had an enjoyable summer and early fall and that you are excited about joining us for another wonderful year of music. The Youth Symphony of Southern Oregon (YSSO) marks its 29th concert season in 2016-2017.

Even after more than two decades with the organization I continue to be amazed by the array of talent in the region. When I have time to walk throughout Ashland each summer I often meet alumni of the YSSO. Former musicians always express to me what a wonderful time they had participating in the YSSO and how being part of a musical team created lifelong memories for them. I always inquire if he or she still plays an instrument. Some have continued to play and some are involved in other pursuits. Regardless of their involvement in music, however, their life stories enrich my life and reassure me that playing an instrument as a youngster helps create articulate, enterprising and purposeful adults. The YSSO looks forward to casting more Youth Symphony alumni into the world again this season. The organization is delighted that audiences, patrons, volunteers and families will be part of the endeavor.

I am excited to share the music selections for our 2016 - 2017 concert season.

The fall concert will feature YSSO alumna Alison Dresser, a 2013 Ashland High School graduate currently studying at Northwestern University, who will perform W.A. Mozart's Horn Concerto No. 4 with the Youth Symphony. I am excited Alison is returning to play with us. She is a wonderful musician and I am confident that her performances will inspire us all. The horn concerto will be paired with Hungarian composer Franz Liszt's Les Preludes. Perhaps the most popular of Liszt's 13 tone poems, the work will be a magnificent showcase for the Youth Symphony. The Youth Orchestra will begin its year with music by Richard Wagner, Ludwig van Beethoven and Franz von Suppé. These three great composers represent the heart of the European Romantic musical period and its emphasis on opera and large symphonic compositions. We will perform a delightful setting of Beethoven's Symphony No. 6 "Pastoral" arranged by Richard Meyer, a march from Suppé's opera Fatinitza arranged by Alfred Pfortner and Wagner's Die Meistersinger arranged by Edmund Siennicki. This powerful music will set the tone for good practice and passionate growth.

The winter series will feature 2016 concerto competition winner Lily Dunlap. She will perform Mozart's *Violin Concerto No. 4* with the

Youth Symphony. Two Mozart concertos in one year! What a great opportunity to study and perform one of the greatest classical composers of all time. How did Mozart write for violin versus horn? We are about to find out. In addition, I am thrilled to introduce to everyone American composer Amy Beach. I couldn't be more excited about the Youth Symphony presenting her masterwork, the Gaelic Symphony. The work, composed in 1894, was the first symphony to be written by an American female composer. Wow, how exciting! The Youth Orchestra will follow suit with Warrior Legacy by contemporary female composer Soon Hee Newbold and Grant Hull's composition entitled Contrasts for Orchestra. This repertoire provides us with an opportunity to examine new styles of composing for orchestra, as well as to hear works by two female composers from two very different times! The winter focus is yes, you guessed it, "Great Women in Music" including our very own Lily Dunlap!

The spring concert series always guarantees wonderful surprises as it is the series which often features a winner of our concerto competition. The concerts this May also will feature the exotic music of Brazilian composer Heitor Villa-Lobos. His music blends the traditions of European classical music with Brazilian folk music. His composition Bachianas Brasileiras No.4 merges these qualities and pays tribute to J.S. Bach. It is a tremendous opportunity for us to study and perform the music of Brazil's most important and prolific classical composer. We will conclude our 2016-2017 season with John William's overture from The Cowboys for a rousingly great time. As always, our music showcases the wonderful talent inside each of the ensembles. I look forward to each piece this year as it challenges, humbles, inspires and unifies us to create great music together.

The Chamber Music Series returns this season with concerts on December 10 and 11. Participating musicians will explore the small group experience with musical friends and colleagues in the Youth Symphony and learn the rewards of learning and playing chamber music. We hope that our advanced level musicians will take advantage of this opportunity and submit an application. We also will present chamber music at the winter Community Outreach Concert for the residents and staff at the Rogue Valley Manor.

Current YSSO musicians who need financial assistance may inquire about the availability of scholarship assistance for private lessons with experienced, professional teachers. The Youth

The Fall Concert Series opens the season with performances on November 5 in Medford at the Collier Center's Craterian Theater and on November 6 at the Oregon Center for the Arts' Recital Hall at Southern Oregon University in Ashland. The program will feature performances by Youth Symphony alumna Alison Dresser. The Winter Concert Series in February 2017 will showcase violinist Lily Dunlap, a winner of the 2016 Concerto Competition. The



Spring Concert Series in May 2017 will include *Bachianas Brasileiras No.4* by Heitor Villa-Lobos and other exciting music.

The season also includes the Chamber Music Series, Concerto Competition and three Community Outreach Concerts at the Rogue Valley Manor. Special fund raising events are being planned by members of the board. Coming up on Saturday, November 19 from 8:00-10:00 a.m. is the "Short Stack for a Tall Cause" Pancake Breakfast Fundraiser at Applebee's Neighborhood Grill and Bar in Medford. Lily Dunlap, Assistant Concertmaster of the Youth Symphony and a winner of the 2016 Concerto Competition, has participated in the YSSO since 2012. An Ashland High School (AHS) sophomore and home-schooled student, her current music teacher at AHS is Lauren Trolley. Her previous AHS music teacher was Gerry Paré. She studies privately with Scott Cole. A multi-instrumentalist, Lily has also studied violin with Morgan O'Shaughnessey and Virginia Wickham, flute with Lisa Nichols, and piano with Michele Alspach. In addition to the YSSO, Lily currently plays in the Rogue Valley Symphony and AHS Chamber Orchestra. She has also participated in numerous festivals and institutes including the Marrowstone Music Festival in Bellingham (WA), Lamont School of Music Summer Academy in Denver (CO), Ashland Chamber Music Workshop at Southern Oregon University, and the East-West Virtuosi String Quartet Institute, among others. Lily has participated in master classes led by James Ehnes, the Dover Quartet, Morgenstern Piano Trio, Adam LaMotte, John McGrosso of the Ariana String Quartet and Dr. Margaret Gries. Her parents are KC Dunlap and Frank Dunlap.

When asked who has inspired her, Lily shared,
"Rachel Barton-Pine was my main inspiration in
starting the violin. I read an article about her when I was seven years old and



it was then that I decided to play violin. Hilary Hahn and the Dover Quartet have also been huge inspirations to me. Playing with [former Youth Symphony Concertmaster] Chloe Brown for four years was a great learning experience and an inspiration for me to keep improving." Following graduation, Lily plans to continue violin study, perform and perhaps become a teacher. Lily wishes to thank her mom and dad "...for their support and for driving her to and from rehearsals," her Great Aunt Nadine for her violin, Grandma Nadine for providing strings and bow hairs, her private music teachers - Virginia Wickham, Morgan O'Shaughnessey and Scott Cole - for their guidance and help, and her orchestra directors - Gerry Paré, Lauren Trolley and Cindy Hutton – for welcoming her into their ensembles.
